**Matters for Discussion**

- 1. Citizen Review Board Discussion.** West Valley Attorney, Bradley Jeppsen, and Citizen Review Board Chair, Abby Dizon-Maughan attended tonight's Council work meeting to answer questions and give insight about a Citizen Review board.

Council Member deWolfe gave a brief overview of the discussion that the Council has had regarding creation of a Citizen Review Board and what issues the Council isn't in full agreement on.

Ms. Dizon-Maughan described the process in place with use of force and how the board reviews these cases and what documents they are provided for consideration for the final recommendation. The board sees every use of force and vehicle pursuits. The board also reviews every citizen complaint but that is not a regular occurrence. This board doesn't have a final say in the discipline of an officer and is a recommending body. The board has a good working relationship with the police chief and that is very important to the board.

Council Member Siwik asked if pepper spray, Tasers and night sticks use is considered use of force.

Ms. Dizon-Maughan said yes. If pepper spray, Tasers and night sticks are deployed that is considered use of force but if they are just displayed that wouldn't be considered use of force as it would if a firearm was displayed.

Council Member Siwik asked who in the City oversees the board and provides training for the board.

Ms. Dizon-Maughan said that Mr. Jeppsen is who oversees the board as well as provides training and he works in the City Attorney's office for West Valley. The Board is also offered the chance to attend all trainings offered to police officers.

Mr. Jeppsen added that all training is provided by the City Attorney's office and normally a new member would go on a police ride along with an officer but that is not currently happening due to COVID.

Council Member Pinkney asked about the public records of complaints and how that is handled.

Mr. Jeppsen said they don't believe that every complaint against an officer is public. Most of the cases reviewed by the board could be released to the public besides unsustained internal affairs investigations and other similar type cases.

Council Member Pinkney asked if officer's names are discussed in a public meeting.

Mr. Jeppsen said that they hold two meetings, one for the public and the other closed door. During closed door session officers names are discussed.

Council Member Thomas asked how many individuals serve on the board and what the board term is.

Ms. Dizon-Maughan said there are seven members on the board and the term is two years. The board meets once a month.

Council Member Thomas asked who selects the members of the board.
